- b. Dedicated Outdoor Air Systems DOAS (Leighton Deer)
  - Stanley Muma, University of Pennsylvania, Instructor that Leighton had
  - Issues with VAV in controlling desired/required OA to zones
  - Two separate air handling systems, 100% OA with Energy recovery (enthalpy wheel) and second for cooling (sensible wheel) using either chiller or DX
  - Recommended for higher occupant loads that varies a lot, not for constant load
